Church School Classes Held In Hospital

The Church School of the Air has recently broadened its work to include Sunday school classes each Friday from 2.30 to 3.30 p. m. for the chil-dren under doctors' care in the Children's Hospital.

The classes, like the church school broadcast series, are being approached by the Maine Council of Churches. The radio series is also heard in the hospital, but personalized religious study has never before been attempted.


